ALTAR SERVERS

Serve God with Gladness: A Manual for Servers (Liturgy Training Publications)

In these pages servers will learn about the different liturgies at which they may be called to serve—Sunday Mass, daily Mass, funerals, weddings, Morning and Evening prayer, the visit of the Bishop.

The Ministry of Servers (Liturgical Press)

A simple and concise, yet comprehensive guide for altar servers and their instructors. Well organized with helpful line drawings, this book will be easily understood by children who fulfill this essential ministry.

ART & ENVIRONMENT FOR WORSHIP

A Place for Baptism (Liturgy Training Publications)

A collection that explores the meaning of Baptism through the design of baptistries. Many styles, old and new, are pictured and examined.

Basket, Basin, Plate and Cup: Vessels in the (Liturgy Training Publications)
