

Father Donald Calloway

Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC, a convert to Catholicism, is a member of the Congregation of Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception. Before his conversion to Catholicism, he was a high school dropout who had been kicked out of a foreign country, institutionalized twice, and thrown in jail multiple times. He has been a priest for 15 years and is the author of 11 books, including the best-sellers "No Turning Back: A Witness to Mercy," "Under the Mantle: Marian Thoughts from a 21st Century Priest," and "Champions of the

Rosary: The History and Heroes of a Spiritual Weapon." His latest book is "St. Joseph Gems: Daily Wisdom on our Spiritual Father."

Teresa Tomeo

Teresa Tomeo is an author, syndicated Catholic talk show host, and motivational speaker with more than 30 years of experience in TV, radio and newspaper, 20 of which were as a secular reporter/anchor in the Detroit market. In the year 2000, Teresa left the secular media to start her own speaking and communications company, *Teresa Tomeo Communications, LLC*. Her weekday morning radio program, *Catholic Connection*, is co-produced by *Ave Maria Radio* in Ann Arbor, Michigan and the




EWTN Global Catholic Radio Network. It is heard on over 500 Catholic radio stations worldwide and on the Sirius Satellite Network.

Teresa is a columnist and special correspondent for the national Catholic newspaper *OSV Newsweekly* and appears frequently on the *EWTN Global Catholic Television Network*. Teresa co-hosts the EWTN television series, The Catholic View for Women, and is a field reporter for their annual *March for Life* coverage in Washington, D.C. Teresa has been featured on *The O'Reilly Factor, Fox News, Fox & Friends, MSNBC, The Dr. Laura Show*, and Dr. James Dobson's *Family Talk Radio*, discussing issues of faith, media awareness, and Catholic Church teaching, especially as it relates to the culture. Bishop Medley

Bishop Medley was born on September 17, 1952 in Marion County, KY to Dorothy C. Hayden Medley and the late James Werner Medley. He was baptized at St. Francis of Assisi Church, St. Francis, KY. After attending Sty. Thomas Seminary High School, Bishop Medley received a Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy and Psychology from Bellarmine University in Louisville and a Master of Divinity from Saint Meinrad School of Theology in St. Meinrad, IN. Before his ordination in 1982, Medley

served as a social worker for the Kentucky Department of Human Resources from 1974 to 1978. Bishop Medley was ordained to the priesthood on May 22, 1982, at the Cathedral of the Assumption by the Archbishop Thomas C. Kelly, O.P. After ordination, Medley became Associate Pastor at St. Pius X Parish in Louisville from 1982 - 1985 while serving as a Chaplain at Assumption High School.

In June 1985, he was assigned as Associate Pastor at the Cathedral of the Assumption, Louisville, where he served until 1988. In June of 1988, he was assigned as Pastor of Saint Benedict Parish, St. Charles Borromeo Parish and Holy Cross Parish, Louisville who merged together in 1990, to become St. Martin de Porres Parish. In 1989, Bishop Medley was appointed Director of the Office of Clergy Personnel.

In September 1993 until June of 2005, Bishop Medley was Pastor of St. Joseph Proto-Cathedral in Bardstown, KY, the original Seat of the Archdiocese of Louisville.

In June of 2005, Bishop Medley was appointed Pastor of Mother of Good Counsel Parish in Louisville and in 2007 he became Pastor of Transfiguration of Our Lord Parish in Goshen, KY. These two parishes merged and became St. Bernadette Parish.

Bishop William F. Medley was ordained the fourth Bishop of the Diocese of Owensboro on February 10, 2010 following the December 15, 2009 announcement from Papal Nuncio, Archbishop Pietro Sambi.

Maria Spears was born in Kentucky and began singing, playing piano and writing music by the age of six. For over 20 years she has been leading worship all over the world, including World Youth Day in Spain and Australia, youth events, conferences, and retreats. In 2016, Maria and two of her friends formed "His Own", a band and womens' ministry. Through music, speaking, blogs and videos, they strive to inspire women



to become all that God has created them to be. They have been featured on *EWTN*, *Catholic Radio*, *Ascension Press* and numerous other media outlets. They recently released their second album, a sung *Chaplet of Divine Mercy*.
