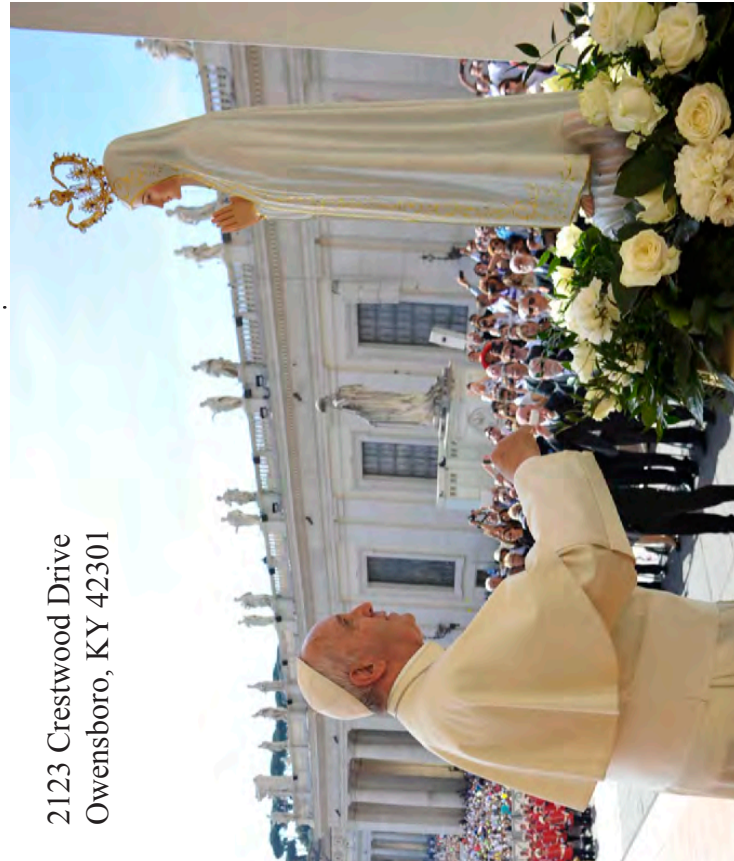

Father D. Andrew Garner

The V. Rev. D. Andrew Canon Garner is Pastor of Saint Joseph Catholic Church and the Episcopal Vicar of Saint Joseph Catholic School in Bowling Green, Kentucky. He serves as the Rector of the Diocesan Shrine of Mary located on the campus Saint Joseph and directs the programs and ministry of the Diocesan Marian Shrine Committee. Father Garner is also a Canon of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem.

Father Wade Menzes

Fr. Wade L. J. Menezes, CPM is a member of the Fathers of Mercy, a missionary preaching Religious Congregation based in Auburn, Kentucky. Ordained a priest during the Great Jubilee Year 2000, he received his Bachelor of Arts Degree in Catholic Thought from the Oratory of St. Philip Neri in Toronto, Canada and his dual Master of Arts and Master of Divinity Degrees in Theology from Holy Apostles Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut. His secular college degrees are in journalism and communications.



Fr. Wade is currently the Assistant General and has served as Director of Vocations and Director of Seminarians for the Fathers of Mercy. Fr. Wade has also served as the Chaplain-in-Residence at the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament of Our Lady of the Angels Monastery in Hanceville, Alabama. While at the Shrine, Fr. Wade was a daily Mass celebrant, homilist, and confessor; he also gave spiritual conferences on specialized points of Catholic Christian doctrine to the many pilgrims who visit the Shrine. Both the Monastery and Shrine are affiliated with EWTN, the Eternal Word Television Network.

Fr. Wade has been a contributing writer for The National Catholic Register, Our Sunday Visitor, Catholic Twin Circle, Catholic Faith and Family publications. Fr. Wade has also been a guest on various episodes of EWTN's "Mother Angelica Live" and "Life on the Rock" programs. He has also hosted several televised series for EWTN, which have covered such topics as the necessity of the spiritual life, the Four Last Things, the Ten Commandments of Catholic Family Life, and the Gospel of Life vs. the Culture of Death. He is also the host of the EWTN segment series "The Crux of the Matter" and "The Wonders of His Mercy". His many theological and doctrinal presentations have been featured on EWTN Radio, Ave Maria Radio, Guadalupe Radio Network, Covenant Network Radio, Catholic Broadcasting Northwest, and Voice of Virtue International.



Susan Brinkman

Susan Brinkmann, O.C.D.S., author and award winning journalist is a member of the Third Order of Discalced Carmelites. She is the staff journalist for Women of Grace® and is a frequent guest on EWTN's Women of Grace® television show.

In addition to two historical fiction novels published by HarperCollins, she is also the author of a book on Carmelite prayer, *Lord Teach Us to Pray*, published by *The Catholic Standard and Times*. Ralph is the president of Renewal Ministries (www.renewalministries.net), an organization devoted to Catholic renewal and evangelization. Renewal Ministries is the sponsor of "The Choices We Face" a widely viewed weekly Catholic television and radio program distributed throughout the world and engages in a wide variety of mission work in more than 30 countries.

He is also the Director of Graduate Theology Programs in Evangelization and a professor of theology at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in the Archdiocese of Detroit (www.shms.edu). He holds a doctorate in theology from the Angelicum University in Rome.

Pope Benedict XVI appointed Ralph as a Consultor to the Pontifical Council for the New Evangelization. He was also appointed as a peritus (theological expert) for the Synod on the New Evangelization which was held in Rome in 2012.

He and his wife Anne reside in Ann Arbor, Michigan and are the parents of six and grandparents of sixteen.

Bishop Medley was born on September 17, 1952 in Marion County, KY to Dorothy C. Hayden Medley and the late James Werner Medley. He was baptized at St. Francis of Assisi Church, St. Francis, KY. After attending St. Thomas Seminary High School, Bishop Medley received a Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy and Psychology from Bellarmine University in Louisville and a Master of Divinity from Saint Meinrad School of Theology in St. Meinrad, IN. Before his ordination in 1982, Medley served as a social worker for the Kentucky Department of Human Resources from 1974 to 1978. Bishop Medley was ordained to the priesthood on May 22, 1982, at the Cathedral of the Assumption by the Archbishop Thomas C. Kelly, O.P. After ordination, Medley became Associate Pastor at St. Pius X Parish in Louisville from 1982 - 1985 while serving as a Chaplain at Assumption High School.



In June 1985, he was assigned as Associate Pastor at the Cathedral of the Assumption, Louisville, where he served until 1988. In June of 1988, he was assigned as Pastor of Saint Benedict Parish, St. Charles Borromeo Parish and Holy Cross Parish, Louisville who merged together in 1990, to become St. Martin de Porres Parish. In 1989, Bishop Medley was appointed Director of the Office of Clergy Personnel.

In September 1993 until June of 2005, Bishop Medley was Pastor of St. Joseph Proto-Cathedral in Bardstown, KY, the original See of the Archdiocese of Louisville.

In June of 2005, Bishop Medley was appointed Pastor of Mother of Good Counsel Parish in Louisville and in 2007 he became Pastor of Transfiguration of Our Lord Parish in Goshen, KY. These two parishes merged and became St. Bernadette Parish.

Bishop William F. Medley was ordained the fourth Bishop of the Diocese of Owensboro on February 10, 2010 following the December 15, 2009 announcement from Papal Nuncio, Archbishop Pietro Sambi.
