Mt. 7:7-8

“Ask, and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks will receive and anyone who seeks will find and the door will be opened to those who knock.”

Mt. 18:19-20

“Again, I tell you, if two of you join your voices on earth to pray for anything whatever, it shall be granted you by my Father in heaven. When two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in their midst.”

Mk. 11:17

“My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples.”

“I give you my word, if you are ready to believe that you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer, it shall be done for you.”

They in turn are to pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. This prayer uttered in faith will reclaim the one who is ill, and the Lord will restore him to health. If he has committed any sins, forgiveness will be his. Hence, declare your sins to one another, and pray for one another, that you may find healing.”

*Reasons why

1. Prayer is how we spend our time forming a close, more perfect relationship with God.
2. Prayer opens our hearts, minds and souls to God’s teachings.
3. Prayer converts us from being self-centered to God-centered.
4. Prayer helps us to cope with the trials and temptations of life.
5. Prayer helps us to see others’ sufferings through the eyes of God.
6. Prayer changes people and people change things.
7. Prayer unites families.
8. Prayer unites faith communities.
